



## **Sports premium funding - Impact Report 2017 - 2018**

### **Background**

The school received £16,600 (April 2017 - March 2018), from the Department for Education to improve the quality of P.E and Sport for all children at New City Primary School

The impact of the Primary PE and Sport funding must highlight an increase in the participation, standards, attainment and progress of all pupils. Additionally, it should encourage pupils to develop healthy lifestyles and support children in reaching the performance levels that they are capable of.

#### **New City Primary School has seen an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:**

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

Pupils enjoy having things to do at lunchtimes and now they have plenty of activities to help them to lead active lifestyles from a young age.  Providing these opportunities to try a variety of equipment has also helped to develop pupil confidence and skills so that more pupils can begin competing at competition level. The Coach teaches the key skills and ensures pupils are learning the correct strategies for swimming and water safety. The pupils have approximately 6 weeks of swimming lessons in Year 3 so having a Coach ensures they are taught all the basic requirements in a timely and accurate manner.</p> <p>Evidence for this: Teacher and pupil feedback</p>

Pupils receive the best training which is helping prepare them for competitions in individual sports.
