| <u>Mathematics</u> | <u>English</u> | <u>Science</u> | |

| <p>Children will be developing their understanding of mathematics and deepening their ability to use a range of numeracy skills to solve problems. They will be counting in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 100. They will identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations. Children will be developing their understanding of fractions and decimals and solve problems using reasoning and explanation.</p> | <p>In the first half of the term children will be studying texts from other cultures such as 'Mufaro's beautiful Daughters'. They will be using this text to develop their literacy skills of grammar, punctuation and spelling. They will be creating extended pieces of writing using a range of organisational devices. In the second half of the term we will be reading stories from other cultures.</p> | <p>In Science we will be studying different types of forces and how they impact our daily lives. In the second half of the term we will be 'Properties and Changes in Materials'. Children will be performing Scientific investigations to see how they can change and alter the properties of different materials.</p> | |
| <u>Art/DT/Geography/History/Music</u> | | | |
| <p>In the first half of the spring term we will be studying the effects that World War 2 had on the East End of London. We will be developing our art skills by creating propaganda posters. The geographical focus during the second half of term will be a study of rainforests, with a particular emphasis on the Amazon rainforest within Brazil. As part of the topic the children will learn about the structure, purpose and importance of the rainforest. They will examine the human impact on rainforests, including deforestation and look to future consequences such as an impact may have. In Music we will be continuing to learn how to play the recorder, this term focusing on putting our skills from last term together to play different pieces of music.</p> | | | |

| <p>We are lucky to be living in such a diverse community here in Plaistow. In religious education Year 4 will be thinking about the neighbourhood and the religions it represents. Pupils will learn about religions in Newham by collecting and interpreting evidence from a range of sources.</p> | <p>In physical education children will be developing their hand and eye coordination as well as their team skills through playing basketball and American Football. Further development of their coordination will be achieved through gymnastics lessons.</p> | <p>In the spring term children will be identifying what helps them with their learning and how to reach their learning goals. In the second half of the term the children will be discussing ideas about improving the school grounds.</p> | |

Maths and English homework should be written in their books. Homework for Maths and English will be consolidating and reinforcing strategies learned that week in class. Alongside this spelling and times tables practise will be given out each week and should be practiced every night in their homework books to consolidate handwriting practice. Please support us in encouraging your children to complete their homework and return it on the correct day.
