

St Andrew's Day

It was St Andrew's Day on 30th November. He is the patron saint of Scotland. He is also the patron saint of Romania, Greece, Russia, Ukraine and Poland. Patron saints are chosen to be special protectors or guardians over things. England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales all have their own patron saint, to whom they dedicate a dav.

We don't actually know a lot about St Andrew. It is believed that he was born between the years 5 AD and 10 AD in a place that is now part of Israel. According to Christianity, he went on to become one of the 12 disciples of Jesus Christ. The disciples were 12 people chosen by Jesus to closely follow him. Andrew's brother, Simon Peter, was also one of the disciples. They both lived in Galilee, where they were fishermen. Funnily enough, St Andrew never actually stepped foot in Scotland his whole life!

Scottish people may celebrate St Andrew's Day in different ways. Some might mark it by going to a special type of party called a ceilidh - pronounced "kay-lee" where they do Scottish country dancing. Traditional food may be eaten, like cullen skink - which is a type of fish soup - or lamb.
