At New City we make use of sensory play tables as an excellent resource to observe children developing likes and dislikes; learning about cause and effect; mirroring each other's actions; deciding to play independently or to collaborate.

Sensory play can, of course, be more structured and used for individual development. However, a child learns, whatever their different abilities and whatever their likes and dislikes in a learning environment, sensory play will always have a place and be an important part of development.




Mr Freeland's Book Review

Anita imagines she is a princess, about to be whisked away to a distant land, astride the back of a formidable white dragon. In reality, she and her family are leaving their home in the Dominican Republic, aboard a great white aeroplane, to move to another country. Descriptive text and evocative illustrations work in perfect harmony to sensitively explore Anita's feelings. Warm, earthy tones represent her happy

island life, while a contrasting palette of cool greys reflect her anxiety as she prepares to board the plane, which sits ominously on the runway. This exceptional picture book about emigration explores how it might feel to venture into the unknown, and demonstrates that with courage and support, worries can be overcome.
