Mr Freeland's Book Review

Set in a rural village on the shores of Papua New Guinea, this is a remarkable tale of love, loss and friendship. Following the death of her parents, Blue Wing moves in with Siringen, a gentle village elder who becomes her waspapi, or guardian. Obsessed by his role as a shark caller, Blue Wing pleads with Siringen to teach her this ancient tradition, but he refuses, fearing that the anger in her heart will lead her to misuse the skills. The inclusion of Papuan Pidgin English words throughout the book enlivens the narrative, particularly when read aloud. Engaging characters, a compelling plot and vivid descriptions of the glorious setting masterfully transport the reader to Blue Wing's is-

land. This exceptional novel, which explores complex emotions of guilt and grief, will remain with the reader long after the final page.



Learning Maths at Home Counting

Younger children should practise counting as often as possible. Here are some ideas for counting games:


Sing number rhymes together.

Give them the opportunity to count a range of interesting objects (coins, pasta shapes etc), encouraging them to touch and move each item as they count it. Then ask them to count things they cannot touch or see (more difficult!) such as claps or jumps.

Look for numbers in the environment, for example in your house or when out shopping.

Cut out numbers from cards, magazines etc. and ask your child to order them

Make deliberate mistakes when counting or ordering numbers. Can your child spot what you have done wrong?
