During Science lessons at New City children have been learning all about Physics. In Reception children have explored with colours by creating rainbows using Skittles. In Year 3 children have learnt about Magnets, this week they explored attraction and polar opposites by observing different magnets repel and attract. Whilst up in Year 5 children have been learning about forces. This week they built their own boats to understand how we can reduce water resistance by making our boats streamlined. Children across the school have a fantastic understanding of how these phenomena affect our own lives.


