



COVID-19 STATEMENT

The Boleyn Trust is following all Department for Education (DfE) and Public Health England (PHE) advice throughout the Covid-19 pandemic.

We are acutely aware of the current level of concern about the risks from coronavirus and the subsequent confirmed cases in the UK. All Trust schools have undertaken rigorous risk assessment processes in close consultation with staff, Trust leaders, governing bodies, and union representatives. Our comprehensive assessments are regularly reviewed and updated as guidance changes.

All schools have put in place several protective measures, based on the available guidance, to manage the identified risks and protect the health, safety and wellbeing of our children, staff and families. We are providing parents, carers, pupils and staff with NHS principles to prevent spreading any respiratory virus and taking all reasonable measures to mitigate infection risk, including and not limited to displaying COVID-19 posters in school, providing advice as to hand washing and minimising risk of infection, providing hand sanitiser gels in receptions and liaising with our cleaning contractors.

We have a communications strategy in place to ensure we are keeping pupils, parents, carers, staff and contractors and visitors aware of measures that Boleyn trust schools are taking.
