
# Head Teacher Update

### Music at New City

At New City all children have the opportunity to play and learn an instrument which is something we're very proud of! This term the children have been focusing on learning new skills with their instruments which were introduced at the start of the school year. In EYFS, the children have been learning the names of percussion instruments and have enjoyed singing along with our new music teacher Billy. After focusing on the interrelated dimension of music last term, KS1 are now preparing for their Christmas Nativity performance. In KS2, all children have the opportunity to learn an individual instrument. In Year 3 they've learnt how to play the C chord on the ukulele, Year 4 have been learning how to read the note B on stave notation and play it on their recorder. Year 5 have been learning how to improvise using notes CDEFG and year 6 are getting ready to play a Christmas classic as an ensemble, on their trumpets and trombones. The Christmas show will be recorded in the next couple of weeks and will be available to watch via our website on the 20th December.
