Acts of Kindness Week and Dress to Express Day

Children's Mental Health Week: Acts of Kindness and Dress to Express Day In the final week before we broke up for the February break, New City raised awareness of Children's Mental Health through as range of activities. We discussed that everyone has mental health, everyone has times that they may feel sad and lonely and what we can do if we feel that way, or notice someone else feeling that way. We explored the 'Five Ways to Wellbeing' - Be Active, Connect, Take Notice, Keep Learning and Give - through the week with different activities such as mini exercises in our classrooms and at lining up time, learning about different emotions and how to express them, taking notice of the weather and gazing at the clouds, connecting with others by asking about their 'Dress to Express' costumes and finally by raising money for our partner school in Uganda and for Place2Be the Children's Mental Health Charity. All pupils in our school pledged to do an 'Act of Kindness' each day over the week and were sponsored by their friends and family. Through these sponsorships, we raised an enormous £603 for the Jireh Rainbow Primary School in Uganda. This will really help the school to begin to rebuild after recent flooding damage, and create flood defences to prevent future damages. On our 'Dress to Express' day, we raised an additional £419 for Place2Be. This has been an amazing charity effort from New City - with over £1000 raised in only one week. The children really enjoyed the fundraising and it was clear how much giving to others also has a great impact on their own wellbeing. A huge thank you to everyone in our school who participated!


Book review By Ms Fuzzi
