At New City, we have a shared vision of Global Citizenship: the concept that we all need to do a 'little bit' for the future well-being of the planet. Today the children learnt more about Earth Day and each class will be planting a sunflower seed for an inter-class competition to see who can grow the tallest sunflower! This is part of our ongoing aim to increase New City's biodiversity by attracting more wildlife. We will also be launching a poster competition based on the best-selling children's book: 'The Lost Words'. This book celebrates UK wildlife. For the competition, we would like the children to choose any UK animal or plant and produce either a fact-file or acrostic poem about the animal or plant. The competition closes on Friday 6th May. Mr Freeland's Book Review The Lost Whale

Feeling abandoned after his mother goes into a hospital for treatment for mental illness, Rio arrives in California to a grandmother he has never met before and does not want to know. Watching the grey whales off the coast, he realises he has a special talent that allows him to hear them. He makes friends among the whale watching community. When one of the whales, the beloved Whitebeak, goes missing, both adults and children join forces to find her. In the common cause to rescue Whitebeak,

families are healed. The Lost Whale has a strong environmental message and an atmosphere aided by the striking illustrations of Levi Pinfold, which help the story come to life, just as it did in the previous collaboration between author and illustrator in The Last Bear
