Language of the Term

Swahili is an official language of Tanzania, Uganda and Kenya, and is used as a lingua franca throughout East Africa.



Stephen Lawrence Day

Friday 22 April was **Stephen Lawrence Day** an annual event held on the date of Stephen's death as a celebration of Stephen's life and legacy.

Stephen's story is both challenging and inspirational. He was a normal young person who made the most of everyday opportunities.



Although his life was short, Stephen provides a positive role model of a life well lived. The tragedy of his murder at such a young age of 18 in an unprovoked racist attack led to profound cultural changes in attitudes to racism, to the law and to police practice. It also paved the way for a greater understanding of discrimination of all forms and new equalities legislation.

Stephen Lawrence Day is about the part we all play in creating a society in which everyone can flourish. It is an opportunity for children and young people



to have their voices heard, make the changes they'd like to see and create a society that treats everyone with fairness and respect. Stephen's legacy is one of promoting tolerance, understanding and peace between all which is a legacy that very much supports our New City ethos and is shared with our children.

William Shakespeare Day

On Saturday 23rd April, we celebrated William Shakespeare's birthday. Shakespeare is a renowned playwright, poet and actor, who is commonly regarded as one of the greatest writers in England's history. Here at New City, we have celebrated him through workshops as part of our World Book Day week and now again our pupils have had the opportunity to explore Shakespeare's works in even more depth. This week Year 5 have been focusing on one of his most famous works: 'Macbeth'. Through comprehension and writing they have developed a deeper understanding of his use of language. Year 4 will have the opportunity to explore 'Midsummer Night's Dream' next week to continue the Shakespeare celebrations.






Mr Freeland's Book Review Dread Wood by Jennifer Killick

But that's the least of their worries once the caretaker lets Naira, Angelo, Gus and Hallie into the school grounds and locks the gate securely behind them.
