	occasions (for unforeseen

	opportunities for all students to attend swimming lessons. This closure forced
	the school to reschedule or cancel
	sessions, resulting in fewer lessons for
	some students compared to others.
	We aim for all students to receive the
	same number of lessons.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]?	59%
	Some students with physical
	disabilities or injuries found it
	challenging to effectively perform
	certain strokes, thereby impacting the
	overall percentage. Moreover, closure on certain occasions (as mentioned
	above) restricted the opportunities for
	students to practice and refine their
	technique in all strokes. We have
	focused our efforts on ensuring pupils
	can swim over 25m using fewer
	strokes.

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What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	66%
	Students with physical disabilities or injuries faced challenges in executing certain strokes, which affected their ability to showcase safe self-rescue techniques. Additionally, occasional closures restricted opportunities for students to practice and refine their skills. All students are aware of what to do in a self-rescue water-based situation.
