Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

These websites offer a variety of books for pupils to choose from. Allowing children freedom of choice is very important and will allow them to develop their own preferences. If a child is not enjoying a book after reading at least 10 -20 pages (depending on the length of the book) they can be encouraged to select a different book which they may find more enjoyable. If your child finds a book they have particularly enjoyed, revisiting this story on more than one occasion will allow them to get explore the text in greater detail and develop a long -lasting bond with a book.
